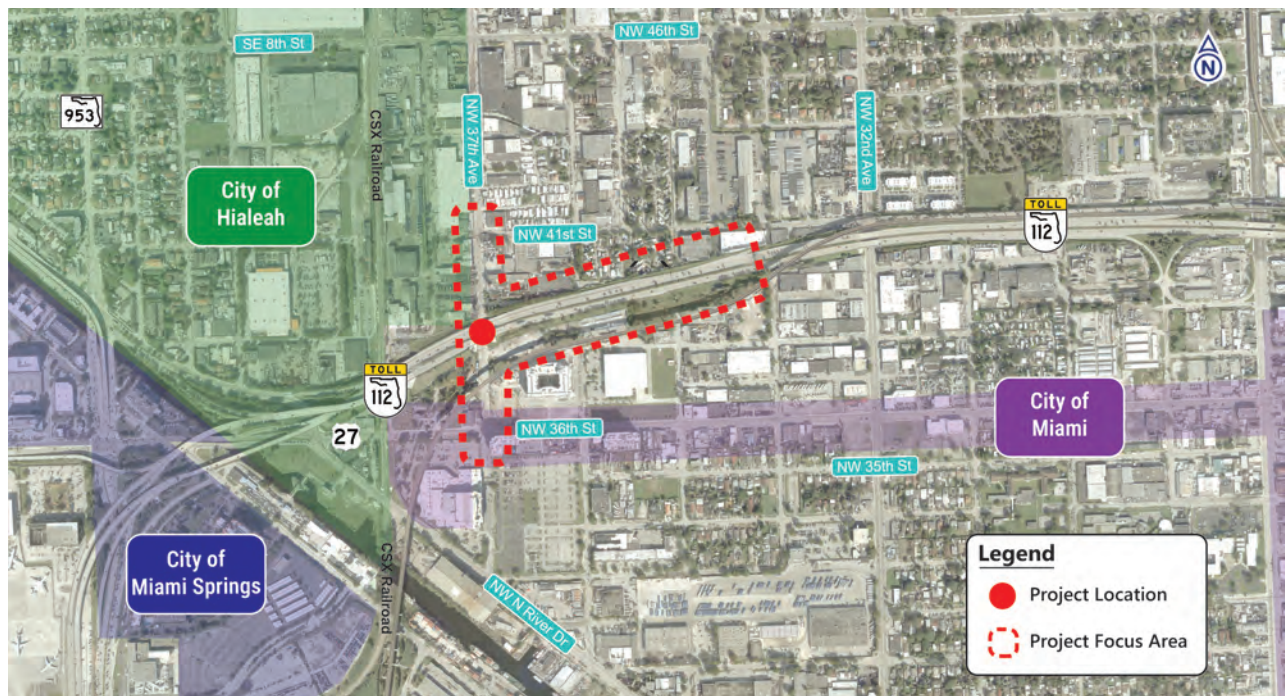
Project Benefits

The proposed partial interchange is expected to provide additional connections to the expressway system, improve mobility and accessibility throughout the area, and enhance overall traffic flow. Additionally, it will address existing and future transportation needs for residents and businesses, support economic growth by providing better access for both businesses and residents, and minimize potential adverse impacts through careful environmental consideration.

Purpose and Need

The purpose of the study is to evaluate potential transportation improvements that enhance mobility, operational efficiency, regional connectivity, and safety within the project area while considering community and environmental factors. The study will include traffic and operational analyses, stakeholder coordination, environmental evaluations, and public involvement activities to identify and evaluate potential improvement alternatives.
